

Project Scoring Potential Based on the Following Criteria

- Readiness/status: Scored low, medium, high categories the same scoring as the IRWM Plan list
- Long term drought preparedness benefit: Scored "high" if the Region's drought mitigation goal is supported, "medium" if any other water supply reliability goals were selected, and "low" if no water supply reliability goals were selected
- Direct benefit to a DAC: Scored low, medium or high categories the same scoring as the IRWM Plan list
- Additional considerations:
 - Human Right to Water Policy: This state policy establishes that every human being has that right to safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water adequate for human consumption, cooking, and sanitary purposes.
 - Project start/complete dates: Additional points awarded for projects that can start by April 1, 2016 and be completed by October 31, 2019
